

Words From The Pastor

I've written before about how I find the process of turning over the sanctuary from one season to the next to be particularly holy. And even though this is true for the change from Advent to Christmas or from Ordinary Time to Christ the King, the sense of holiness is most palpable during the shift from Holy Week to Easter. And this year it seemed even more present.

During Holy Week, we move from the bright joy of Palm Sunday, to the dark sorrow of Good Friday, and back again to the unsurpassed good news of Easter. On Maundy Thursday, the black cloth covered everything in preparation for Jesus' crucifixion, and on Friday, we both mourned the cruelty of and rejoiced in the gift of that death.


But on Good Friday, while our minds and hearts were contemplating the death of Christ, there was already good news waiting behind the scenes – there were already signs of the resurrection waiting to be revealed.

In the classroom turned storage closet just outside the sanctuary, not only were Easter banners ready to adorn the barren walls, but there were also 31 beautiful, sweet-smelling lilies waiting to fill our sanctuary as a symbol of new life. And, although the collection of imposing, bare sticks covered in black cloth continued to stand menacingly in their prominent spot, the baptistry just behind them was filled and ready to celebrate the adoption of a new brother into the family of God.

In the weeks since Easter I've thought about these "hidden signs" more than once. And the more I've thought about them the more I've come to see them as a parable of sorts. Jesus tells all kinds of parables – he takes a look at the ordinary things around him and uses those things to teach his disciples about the Kingdom of God. And, to my mind, having baptismal waters and Easter lilies waiting in the wings amid the darkness of death of Good Friday certainly qualifies.

For even though we may not always be able to see it, the Kingdom of God is here. With the resurrection of Jesus, it was initiated and with our faithful discipleship, it continues to be present. The resurrection and new life that has been secured for us is a sure promise from our good and gracious God. And though sin and death continue to make their painful presence known in a world that is not yet fully redeemed, we can nevertheless trust that those things will, one day, give way fully to God's Kingdom.

So, as we continue into Spring and begin the transition to summer, I hope that you will continue to hold tightly to the promises of Easter, that you will cling to the steadfast love of God, and that you will embrace the inevitability God's coming Kingdom.
