WORDS FROM THE PASTOR...

If summer seems to have held on a little too long, then winter seems to have arrived a little too early. And I don't know many of us who are happy to have seen it come so soon. We've missed entirely, it seems, the glorious days of autumn's bright sun, brilliant leaves, and brisk mornings. Instead, when we look outside, we find winter's gloomy shades of gray and brown already present.

But I think winter gets a bad rap. Don't get me wrong, I thoroughly enjoy fall, and winter is by no means my favorite season. But winter does have something to offer us. And I'm not talking just about cozy fires, warm cups of cocoa, and dazzling Christmas lights - although, those certainly do make the season more enjoyable. What I think winter offers us, and what I hope you will seek to find in this coming winter season, is the chance to be reflective and to prepare.

I have always been struck by the desolate beauty of a leafless wood; I'm mesmerized every time I walk along a trail in the winter. No matter which way I look, I can see deeper and further into the forest that surrounds me. A rock formation or a clearing that might have otherwise been hidden away by the lush foliage of summer now stands in the open, ready to be approached and explored. In the winter, we can see things that we would have never been able to see in some other season.

But that truth is not so for nature only. In our lives as well, winter offers us a chance to glimpse at things that lie a little deeper; to ponder things that might otherwise get lost in the shuffle of another season. The mere fact that winter has arrived, however, does not mean that reflection is sure to follow. With the rush and stress of Thanksgiving and Christmas, of the end of one semester and the beginning of the next, winter can easily become as busy as the other three.

But in the midst of that busyness I hope that you will carve out some time for yourself to sit quietly and look through the leafless trees to see what might be there. Has God shown up somewhere unexpected? Are there new, unseen ways that God might be calling you to discipleship? Can you now see God's presence where you once thought him absent?

And in the act of winter's reflection you will also be preparing for the return of spring and summer. You'll know what lies hidden behind the leaves. Though you may no longer see as clearly, you'll remember where God showed up or what God was calling to you. So, I hope that you will meet the gray, gloomy, leafless days of winter with a heart and a mind ready to reflect and to keep an eye peeled for God.


More importantly, we sing for the Lord and praise His name, which brings joy to others. Please consider joining us during this special time of the church year.
