Kealohilani Samuel Ahai retired from the US postal service after 42 years. He is many things including a father to 4 grown children, a widow, a grandfather, a canoe paddling coach and an artist. His interest in watercolor art began in the 7th grade when watching friends paint in art class. In his own words he describes his work as various themes. "There are sailing canoes, stormy seas, volcanic eruptions, western themes, meadows, winter scenes, night and early morning scenes, just about anything that my imagination can conjure will make it onto a canvas. Some of my art work are to real places that I have seen and then recreated others are out of my imagination. My exploration of watercolors never really went away throughout my life, however it really picked up once I retired from

the post office. This is when I started taking a beginning watercolor class at the Ala Wai Park. Esther Nowell was my teacher and still is. Once I began I was painting 3 or 4 paintings a week and still wanting to do more. Alongside the varying of subjects I also use different sizes from small miniature sized to large scale pieces. This will be my first art showing, I am so thankful to the Unitarian Church for giving me this opportunity. I never dreamed that this could be a possibility but here we are. I am looking forward to being able to share my art work with so many.” The gallery team is excited to provide this first step for Kealohilani’s artist career and we hope you enjoy viewing his work.

Being part of a connected, compassionate and caring community yields benefits beyond expectations. Nan Kleiber describes her experience as a participant: "I found the experience enlightening as a method of communication, and enlivening as an opportunity to meet and become acquainted with NEW people, that is ones I don't already know, in our church community. I especially enjoy the multigenerational character of our group." Chalice Circles are 510 people who meet twice a month for two hours to explore preselected topics. Each group is guided by a trained facilitator and members agree to follow a set of guidelines for respectful group interaction. Membership requires commitment to regular attendance twice each month June through December 31, 2015. (Carla Allison)
