Transformational thought leader, Charles Eisenstein, will join us in the Sanctuary via Skype (on “the Big Screen”) Sunday at 12 noon, Nov 29th. He is the inspiring author of *The Ascent of Humanity*, *Sacred Economics*, and *The More Beautiful World Our Hearts Know is Possible*, in which he presents the path to a “. . . shift from consumption to contribution, transaction to trust, scarcity to abundance, and isolation to community.” Our current economic system reflects the false cultural stories of Separation and Scarcity. The new story we seek is of Reunion, in which we acknowledge our oneness with one another and with the rest of our natural world, focusing on our collaborative and creative abilities and the renewal of our natural environment. Charles shares a vision of practical change for bringing our economy closer to our ideals of fairness and democracy, as we re-write the rules of our economic system.

This exciting opportunity for dialog with Charles is presented by the Social Justice Council and its Economic Justice Action Group (EJAG). We will be asking what Charles has seen as being most effective in bringing about positive change at the local level.
